Some of his singular works have been: Beauty and the Beast - Gaston, Aladdin - Jafar, The Lion King - Pumbaa, The Fox and the Hound - Amos Slade, The Great Mouse

Detective - Dawson, The Little Mermaid - Triton, Pocahontas John Smith, Hercules - Titan and Cyclops, This is just a quick overview of some of the projects he has been associated with. There are others where he has been both an animator AND a supervising animator, such as The Hunchback of Notre Dame & Djali, Atlantis: The Lost Empire & Dr. Sweet, Fantasia 2000 & lead character animator "Firebird." I feel certain that the stories that Ron could tell us would amaze us and have us in stitches with laughter. Personally, I remember the hilarity and nervousness created when Rick Valasek informed Jeff Katzenberg of the color differences of Simba's chest in The Lion King, after it had been in theatrical release for almost a year. That was not a Disney release and I am certain that most animators knew of it. Animators have a tendency to notice any small detail, such as the small details within The Hunchback of Notre Dame that has really small details from Beauty and the Beast and Lion King when the "camera" panned over Paris when Quasimodo is singing Out There. Yes, I am a trivia geek when it comes to cartoon movies. Personally, I am looking forward to getting some other inside trivia from Ron during his time at ATX. Then watch the people of ATX start looking at some of his previous work to try and find some of the smallest details in some of the recent Disney releases on DVD and Blu Ray.
