For example a 300 mm lens becomes a 480 mm lens with its 1.6 crop factor. Will we be showing many of the images at this month's ATX meeting? I wish. Well it's here and all told, I am amazed at just how well the whole suite blends together as Creative Kit which is Intensify Pro + Snapspeed Pro. Intensify Pro and Snapspeed Pro are probably all you need for most of your photography. One day this past week Lynette had a chance to work for a few minutes on her workstation and did some preliminary editing on one particular image. She then took Intensify Pro and compared it to another like minded application (which I won't disclose) and compared them. One on one screen and the other on her other screen. We are talking about two calibrated high end monitors.

The Intensify Pro image was easier to control AND Intensify can create that new image as a new, separate layer or replace the original back into Lightroom! But wait, there's even more! You can create a mask with Intensify! I will let Mornee do that at the meeting. This is really interesting and useful. However this is only the start of what MacPhun's newest product line can do. How many times have you wished you could have re-composed the image before you tripped the shutter and wished you could put the focus of your viewer's attention on the subject and not other things are in focus and may take away from where you want to direct the viewer's attention. Yes, there are other defocusing apps that I have tried and while they do sort of work, the results are less than spectacular. So you try to vignette the image and that does not work quite the way the way you want. Well MacPhun was listening and they now have Focus and Focus 2 Pro. Here you can focus, lens blur, motion blur, and tilt-shift with just one tool. And it really works. Want to learn even more about MacPhun products? Try this.
