We just got back from WPPI (Wedding and Portrait Photographers International) in Las Vegas. While there, we saw and met with several companies and we are negotiating for upcoming ATX presentations. We finally are going to have Joe Brady at our June 17, meeting and we may also have a photo walk either a day before or after at an additional nominal fee. More details as we get closer. We are also working with Katrin Eismann to be a speaker later this year. Again, details in the Full Bulletin closer to the actual date. This will be Katrin's ONLY public appearance on the West Coast this year. And we were able to get several "goodies" for raffles.

We also found and purchased a new device that turns your smartphone into an imaging or video device controllable with Blue Tooth and/ or usable within 100 feet. It is a trigger-like device mounted on a mini tripod. Yes, I will show it and we are securing a super discount for ATX member - even though we paid full price! Our speaker for Februrary 18, is Rick Valasek. Rick is going to open up a new world of photographic lighting using what he calls the Light Lab. We'll start with a dim set and slowly add a wide variety of lights and modifiers, everything from "natural" (sunlight) to quite complex electronic flash units and reflectors. The emphasis will be on creating the best lighting with just one speed light (since that is what most people have access to.) Rick will show how to create fantastic effects without the need to rent or purchase expensive lights. Sometimes just the sun, a diffusion sheet and a simple 11 dollar reflector can create a masterpiece. We will learn how ANY lighting source affects the subject and the background; and how you can REALLY control the effect. At the conclusion of the *Light Lab* you should be able to make the transition from "dealing" with tricky lighting conditions to bending that lighting to your creative will! In other words - this will be an educational meeting with affordable tools!
